**Special Notes for all Foreign Language Majors:**

- At least 40 of the total 120 hours required for graduation must be in 300-400-level courses.
- No course in which a C- or lower grade is earned will be counted toward the major; pass/fail courses do not count either.
- No course may be repeated for credit toward the major unless so designated, or count for both the major and minor.
- Of the 34 hours required for the major, at least 15 must be taken in residence at WSU. These 15 credits may not be earned using advanced placement or challenge exam credit.
- Credits for 105, 205, 305, and 405 may not be applied toward the major.
- A maximum of 12 credits per semester OR 18 credits per year may be transferred from study abroad.



## Additional Recommendations:

- Students are urged to take at least one additional film, culture or literature course taught in English at the 100-level (Fren/Chin/Ger/Rus/Span 110 [H], 111 [G], 120 [H], 121 [G], 130 [H], 131 [G]) to fulfill one of their GER requirements.
- Students may take a capstone [T] course in a different language option than the one they are majoring in (Fren 410, 430; Rus 410, 430; Span 430) OR take the ForL 410 capstone course ("Seminar on Comparative Foreign Film").
- It is highly recommended that students study abroad in order to increase fluency in the target language and to familiarize themselves with the culture of a region where that language is spoken. Seek advice early from the study abroad coordinator in the language section regarding credits earned abroad. Students going abroad should enroll in ForL 221 (1 cr.)



## Special Notes for the Foreign Language Major:

- At least 40 of the total hours required for graduation from WSU must be in 300-400 level courses.
- A minimum of 34 hours beyond the 203 level (or the equivalent level in competence) in the major language is required for a Bachelor of Arts degree in Foreign Languages and Literatures. 101, 102, and 203 do not count toward the major. Students who place into 102 and receive a B or better qualify for an additional 4 departmental advanced placement credits; students placing into 203 and receiving a B or better qualify for 8 departmental advanced placement credits. A maximum of 8 advanced placement credits are possible. See department for details.
- Majors must complete either a minor in a second foreign language, a concentration of at least 16 credits in a related field, or a second major.
- No course in which a C- or lower grade is earned will be counted toward the major.
- 300-400 level courses taken pass/fail may not be included for credit toward the major.
- No course may be repeated for credit toward the major.
- No course may count for both the major and the minor.
- Of the 34 hours required for the major, a minimum of 15 must be taken in residence at WSU with 6 hours at the 400-level in residence.
- Credits for 105, 205, and 305 may not be applied toward the major.
